[. . .] I & my Family are in perfect Health, & we are in comfortable circumstances. Marsh-Mallows, I have frequently tried, when I have been disordered; & I am now using the Precautions of Lime-Water & Pill Sapo.

Marsh-Mallows

A Manual of Materia Medica, by John Aikin (1785) defines marsh mallow as "a perennial plant, growing in marshes" (13); it was traditionally used to treat gastrointestinal disorders.
